Elizabeth “Betsey” Tilson, MD, MPH, FAAP, FACPM, is the State Health Director and the Chief Medical Officer for the NC Department of Health and Human Services. Dr. Tilson is also a practicing primary care pediatrician at the Wake County Human Services Child Health Clinic in Raleigh, NC.

Ana Rappold, PhD, is a Principal Investigator with the EPA’s Environmental Public Health Division of National Health and Environmental Effects Research Lab in Chapel Hill, NC. Her research is focused on the health effects of air pollution and wildfire smoke.

David Diaz-Sanchez, PhD, is the Chief of Clinical Research Branch and the Acting Director of the Environmental Public Health Division of the EPA. His work of the last twenty years has been on asthma and the effects of pollutants on the immune system.
